## Message of the Minister





The recruitment of 1435 female and 1016 male lecturers of different subjects by the Punjab Public Service Commission is in the final phases. HED, Punjab has issued posting orders to the candidates so far selected by the PPSC.



## Collaboration with Development Partners



HED, Punjab has initiated discussions with development partners like UNICEF, British Council, JICA etc. The main purpose of this initiative is to get technical and/or financial support from development partners for the capacity building of college staff.

The Secretary, HED held a meeting with the Chief of Education Sector of UNICEF, Punjab. The following are the main decisions of the said meeting;

1. A Technical Working Group will be established (consisting of UNICEF and HED representatives) for identifying the areas of collaboration to be included in UNICEF's next year plan of action.
2. UNICEF will include HED in its Technical Working Groups to disseminate various capacity building resources to the teachers and managers of colleges.
3. HED, Punjab will communicate with UNICEF Head Office to seek prompt technical and financial support for;
  - a. Extension of WASH (Water And Sanitation Hygiene) programme to public colleges
  - b. Assessment of hygiene and inclusive education-related provisions in public colleges

The Secretary, HED also held a virtual meeting with the Higher Education Team of British Council, Pakistan. Various ways of collaboration were discussed concerning the capacity building of teachers, managers and examiners in areas like;

  - Assessment techniques
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
## Promotion/Examination Policy 2021



# Re-inventing the Tertiary Education





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## Capacity Building of Directors and Deputy Directors


